- MAP 21=\$75 billion
- MN Federal Aid Highways= \$1.2 billion
- ND Federal Aid Highways =\$483 Million
- SD Federal Aid Highways= \$549 Million
- Performance Management= tracks national goals, traffic fatalities etc...
